

Introduction to the course

The relative adverbs *where, when & why* can be used to join sentences or clauses. They replace the more formal structure of *preposition + which* used to introduce a relative clause.

Easy Examples of Relative Adverbs

In all the examples on this page, the relative adverbs are in bold and the adjective clauses are shaded.

Let's look at the three relative adverbs. Each one has its own role:

- "Where" introduces an adjective clause describing a place.
 - I know the town where you live.
- "When" introduces an adjective clause describing a time.
 - They're talking about an era when a promise was a promise.
- "Why" introduces an adjective clause describing a reason.
 - It is the reason why I left.

| Tell me the reason for which you came home late. | Tell me (the reason) why you came home late. |
| Do you want to know the reason for which he is angry with Sally? | Do you want to know (the reason) why he is angry with Sally? |
