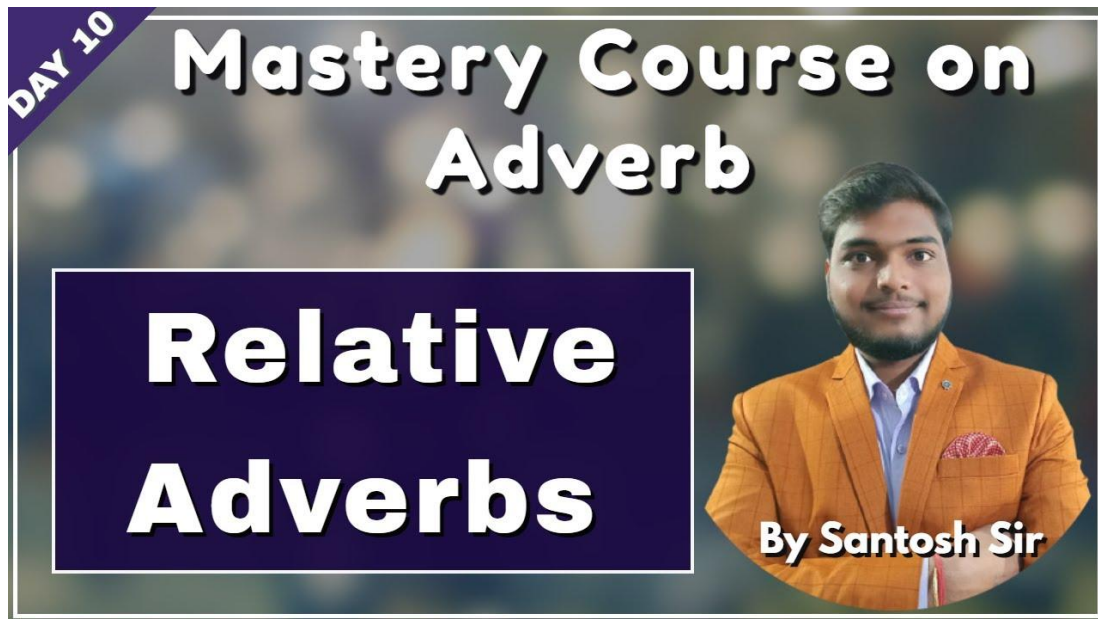

## Introduction to the course

## Relative adverbs

The relative adverbs *where*, *when* & *why* can be used to join sentences or clauses. They replace the more formal structure of *preposition + which* used to introduce a relative clause.

### Easy Examples of Relative Adverbs

In all the examples on this page, the relative adverbs are in bold and the adjective clauses are shaded.

Let's look at the three relative adverbs. Each one has its own role:

- "Where" introduces an adjective clause describing a place.
  - I know the town **where** you live.
- "When" introduces an adjective clause describing a time.
  - They're talking about an era **when** a promise was a promise.
- "Why" introduces an adjective clause describing a reason.
  - It is the reason **why** I left.

Formal structure, preposition + which	More common structure using a relative adverb
That's the restaurant <b>in which</b> we met for the first time.	That's the restaurant <b>where</b> we met for the first time.
That picture was taken in the park <b>at which</b> I used to play.	That picture was taken in the park <b>where</b> I used to play.
I remember the day <b>on</b>	I remember the day <b>when</b> we first

<b>Formal structure, preposition + which</b>	<b>More common structure using a relative adverb</b>
<b>which</b> we first met.	met.
There was a very hot summer the year <b>in which</b> he was born.	There was a very hot summer the year <b>when</b> he was born.
Tell me <b>the reason for which</b> you came home late.	Tell me (the reason) <b>why</b> you came home late.
Do you want to know <b>the reason for which</b> he is angry with Sally?	Do you want to know (the reason) <b>why</b> he is angry with Sally?
