

### **Interrogative adverbs**

An Interrogative Adverb is an adverb that asks a question about place, time, manner, or reason.

The interrogative adverbs *why, where, how, & when* are placed at the beginning of a question. These questions can be answered with a sentence or a prepositional phrase. After an interrogative adverb in a question, you must invert the subject and verb so that the verb comes first.

#### Examples

नमस्ते ! english

- •Why are you so late? There was a lot of traffic.
- •Where is my passport? In the drawer.
- •How are you? I'm fine.
- •When does the train arrive? At 11:15.

#### Uses of how

How can be used to form questions in four different ways. How can be used by itself to mean "in what way".

Examples

- •How did you make this sauce?
- •How do you start the car?
- •How can I get to your house?

How can be used with adjectives to ask about the degree of an attribute. Examples

- •How tall are you?
- •How old is your house?
- •How angry is mother?

How can be used with much and many to ask about quantity. *Much* is used with uncountable nouns and *many* is used with countable nouns.

Examples

नमस्ते ! english

- •How many people are coming to the party?
- •How much flour do I need?
- •How much are these tomatoes?

How can be used with other adverbs to ask about the frequency or degree of an action.

Examples

- How quickly can you read this?
- •How often do you go to London?
- How loudly does your brother scream?
