



DEFINITION:

Reflexive pronouns are words

like myself, yourself, himself, herself, itself, ourselves, yourselves and them selves. They refer back to a person or thing.

Reflexive pronouns are words ending in *-self* or *-selves* that are used when the subject and the object of a sentence are the same (e.g., *I believe in myself*). They can act as either objects or indirect objects. The nine English **reflexive pronouns** are *myself*, *yourself*, *himself*, *herself*, *oneself*, *itself*, *ourselves*, *yourselves*, and *themselves.reflexive* is related to *reflect*; this is useful to remember because a **reflexive pronoun** *reflects back* upon a sentence's subject.

examples

I fell over and hurt myself.

Be careful with that knife. You might cut yourself.

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- Yourselves
- Ourselves

SENTENCES WITH REFLEXIVE PRONOUNS

- 1. Mohan was in a hurry, so he washed the car himself.
- 2. You're going to have to drive *yourself* to school today.
- 3. He wanted to impress her, so he prepared pizza *himself*.
- 4. Julia does chores *herself* because she doesn't trust others to do them right.
- 5. We don't have to go out; we can fix lunch *ourselves*.

MORAL STORY(improve reading skill and listening skill) Reflexive pronoun(underline)
