



DEFINITION

Reflexive pronoun is used as an object when the subject of a sentence and its object are the same person or thing. These reflexive pronouns always end in *-self* or *-selves*.

They include: adapt, complain, concentrate, get up, hide, lie down, meet, move, relax, remember, shave, shower, sit down. 2. After a preposition of place or location we use a personal **pronoun** and not a **reflexive pronoun**

Exception of reflexive pronoun

EXCEPTION-1

Don't use reflexive pronouns when the verb is something someone does every day.

She dries **herself** with a towel after every shower.

John dressed **himself** for the meeting.

In cases like this where the verb describes something that is a common occurrence, you simply don't need the reflexive pronoun.

She dries with a towel after every shower.

John dressed for the meeting.

However, you should use the reflexive pronoun if you need it for emphasis. John dressed **himself** for the meeting even though he only had one arm. Clearly, John is doing something exceptional and the use of the reflexive pronoun helps to bring out that fact

EXCEPTION-2.

Don't use reflexive pronouns after prepositions of place. Incorrect: *Mary placed the mixing bowl beside herself.* Correct:



Mary placed the mixing bowl beside her.

EXCEPTION-3

Don't use reflexive pronouns after "with."

In this case, we are referring to the preposition *with* when it means "accompanied by."

Incorrect:

Jordan took some jelly beans with herself to the show. Correct:
