DEFINITION:

Pronoun is used in place of a specific noun mentioned earlier in a sentence so that you don't have to keep saying/writing that particular noun.

Example:

Mohan is a good boy. <u>He</u> gets up early in the morning. (Here, you don't have to mention 'Mohan' again) that is associated primarily with a particular person, in the grammatical sense.

- **Personal pronoun**-that is associated primarily with a particular person, in the grammatical sense.I,you,we,they,
- Demonstrative pronouns normally indicate the closeness of or distance from the speaker, either literally or symbolically. This, these, that, and those are the demonstrative pronouns.

- Relative pronouns introduce the relative clause. They are used to make clear what is being talked about in a sentence. They describe something more about the subject or the object
- Distributive pronoun is a pronoun which denotes persons or things of group separately that's why they always become singular and followed by the singular verbs. each, either, neither
