



#### Demonstrative Pronouns

A demonstrative pronoun is a pronoun that represents a noun and expresses its position as near or far (including in time). The demonstrative pronouns are "this," "that," "these," and "those."

### Easy Examples of Demonstrative Pronouns

- This is ludicrous.
- Is that yours?
- Eat these tonight.
- Throw those away.
  - This was my mother's ring.
  - That looks like the car I used to drive.
  - These are nice shoes, but they look uncomfortable.
  - Those look like riper than the apples on my tree.
  - Such was her command over the English language.

### MORAL STORY (underline the pronoun)

one summer's day a Grasshopper was hopping about, chirping and singing to <u>its</u> heart's content. An Ant passed by, bearing along with great toil an eara of corn <u>he</u> was taking to the nest.

"Why not come and chat with me," said the Grasshopper, "instead of toiling and moiling in that way?"

"I am helping to lay up food for the winter," said the Ant, "and recommend you to do the same."

"Why bother about winter?" said the Grasshopper; "We have got plenty of food at present." But the Ant went on its way and continued its toil.



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When the winter came the Grasshopper had no food and found itself dying of hunger - while <u>it</u> saw the ants distributing every day corn and grain from the stores they had collected in the summer. Then the Grasshopper knew: <u>It</u> is best to prepare for days of need.

#### Demonstrative Pronoun vs. Demonstrative Adjective

Are you wondering about the difference between demonstrative pronouns and demonstrative adjectives? Since some of the same <u>demonstrative pronouns</u> (this, that, these, those) can also be used as demonstrative adjectives, it can be challenging to tell the difference. The key lies with the sentence structure.

- A demonstrative pronoun takes the place of a noun phrase that has already been mentioned. (It always comes after the noun.)
- A demonstrative adjective modifies the noun and is always followed by the noun. (It always comes efore the noun.)

To illustrate, review some demonstrative adjectives that modify underlined nouns:

- That <u>food</u> you're cooking smells delicious.
- Did you finally throw away that old <u>t-shirt</u>?
- This bendy yoga pose really hurts.
- Is this <u>book</u> yours or mine?
- What is that frightening <u>creature</u>?
- These pink <u>cupcakes</u> are my favorites.
- I told you **those** old <u>magazines</u> were a fire hazard.
