



DEFINITION:

Distributive pronoun is a pronoun which denotes persons or things of group separately that's why they always become singular and followed by the singular verbs.

This pronoun is used to indicate all the members of representative group. Some of the distributive pronouns are like each, either, neither, everyone, any, none, no one, etc.

Each, either and **neither** are called **distributive pronouns** because they refer to persons or things one at a time.

Note that a distributive pronoun is always singular and as such it should be followed by a singular noun and verb.



- Each new day is different. (NOT Each new days are different.)
- Either girl can do that. (NOT Either girls can do that.)
- Neither answer is correct. (NOT Neither answers is correct.)
 (NOT Neither answers are correct.)
- Notes
- Each of, neither of and either of are followed by plural nouns and singular verbs.
- Each of the answers is correct. (NOT Each of the answer is correct.)
- Neither of the girls can do that. (NOT Either of the girl can do that.)
- Either and neither should be used only in speaking of two persons or things. When more than two persons or things are spoken of, any, no one or none should be used.
- None of the three answers is correct. (NOT Neither of the three answers is correct.)
- We invited several friends, but none came. (NOT ... but neither came.)
- You can take any of the three shirts. (NOT You can take either of the three shirts.)

Each can go in different positions.

- Each of the boys was given a present.
- The boys were each given a present.
- They have each been told.



- Each of them have been told.
- We each think the same.
- Each of us think the same.

Gap filling

- Each of the students have participated in the drama act.
- I may buy either of these two gifts.
- Neither of them plays well.
- Each one of you will be awarded with bravery award.
- Everyone must finish the breakfast.

Moral story(underline distributive pronouns)

- A boy named Raj was upset because he had done poorly
 in test his <u>Each</u> of the students performed very well in
 English test. He was sitting in his room when his
 grandmother came and comforted him. His grandmother sat
 beside him and gave him a pencil. Raj looked at his
 grandma puzzled, and said he didn't deserve a pencil after
 his performance in the test. "From today onward <u>none</u> of my
 friends will talk to me"
- His grandma explained, "Each of the days you have to face challenge. You can learn many things from this pencil because it is just like you. It experiences a painful sharpening, just the way you have experienced the pain of not doing well on your test. Neither of your friends will not come to experience your pain. However, it will help you be a better student. Just as all the good that comes from the



pencil is from within itself, you will also find the strength to overcome this hurdle. And finally, just as this pencil will make its mark on any surface, you too shall leave your mark on anything you choose to." Raj was immediately consoled and promised himself that he would do better.
