#### **DEFINITION:**

A relative pronoun is a pronoun that heads an adjective clause .The relative pronouns are "that," "which," "who," "whom," and "whose."

An adjective clause is a multiword adjective that includes a subject and a verb.

The function of a relative pronoun is to head (or introduce) an adjective clause. An adjective clause follows a noun:

#### 1) To identify it.

#### To tell us something interesting about it.

The following sentences contain examples of relative pronouns. The relative pronoun in each example is underlined.

- 1. The cyclist <u>who</u> won the race trained hard.
- 2. The pants *that* I bought yesterday are already stained.

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 The four team leaders, <u>whoever</u> the committee selects, will be at tomorrow's meeting.

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- 4. Noddles, <u>which</u> we eat at least twice a week, is one of my family's favorite meals.
- 5. Where did you buy the dress *that* you wore last week?
- 6. The book, *when* it was finally returned, was torn and stained.
- The s on the corner, <u>where</u> we usually buy all of our art supplies, burned to the ground.

Who	used for people: replaces subject pronouns like I, she, he, we, they	It was my husband <b>who</b> broke the car door.
whose	shows possession or relationship	This is the girl <b>whose</b> notes I borrowed.
whom	replaces object pronouns like me, her, him	The man <b>whom</b> they found was sent home.
which	used for objects and animals (typically non- defining clauses)	The robots, <b>which</b> were waiting outside, were ready for shipment.
That	used for people and things (typically defining clauses)	The piggy bank <b>that</b> was on my desk got broken.

# MORAL STORY-KING AND HIS PAINTING(UNDERLINE THE RELATIVE PRONOUNS)
