




DEFINITION:

Formation of Adjectives :

In previous class we have read there are three degree of comparison of adjective positive degree comparative degree superlative degree

In this session we will learn rule 3 and 4 of degree of formation of comparative an superlative degree

Rule 3 When a positive word of one syllable ends in a single consonant preceded by a short vowel this consonant is doubled before adding er and est

- Red Redder reddest
- big bigger biggest
- hot hotter hottest
- Thin thinner thinnest
- Sad sadder saddest

Rule 4 adjectives of more than two syllables and many of those with two form the comparative by using the adverb more with the positive and super lative by using the adverb most with positive.

Splendid, more splendid, most splendid



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- beautiful, more beautiful, most beautiful
- difficult more, difficult most difficult
- industrious, more industries, most industries
- learned, more learned most learned

syllable -a word or a part of a word which contains one vowel sound mad

- two syllable word is a word that once spoken has two specific sound or beats to them .

Example: mattress

Adverb adverb is a word or an expression that generally modifies a verb adjective or another verb heavily

- madly
- deeply
