Present perfect tense (answer positive)	
राम स्कूल जा चुका है।	Ram has gone to school.
हमने तुम्हें देख लिया है।	We have seen you.
मैंने उसे एक किताब दी है।	l have given him a book.
उन बच्चों ने राम से पैसे लिये हैं।	Those children have taken money from Ram.
Present perfect tense (answer negative)	
हमने तुम्हें नहीं देखा है।	We have not seen you.
मैंने उसे कोई किताब नहीं दी है।	l haven't given him any book.
अरनवी ने पैसे नहीं लिये हैं।	Arnavi has not taken the money.
उस लड़की ने स्कूटी खरीदी है।	That girl has bought Scooty.
Present perfect tense (Questions)	
क्या राम घूमने गया है?	Has Ram gone for a walk?
क्या अमन ने किताब ली है?	Has Aman taken book?
क्या वे दोनों गये हैं?	have they both gone?

उदाहरण : Question in (present perfect continuous tense)

Prsent Perfect continuous (answer positive)	
मैं सुबह से गाने गा रहा हूँ।	I have been singing songs since Morning.
वह 4 बजे से पढ़ रहा है।	He has been studying since 4 o'clock.
वो कल शाम से मुझसे लड़ रहा है।	He has been fighting with me since yesterday Evening.

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Prsent Perfect continuous (Answer				
Negetive)				
राम 2 घंटे से नहीं घूम रहा है।	Ram has not been walking for 2 hours.			
वह 4 बजे से नहीं पढ़ रहा है।	He has not been studying since 4 o'clock.			
मैं सुबह से गाने नहीं गा रहा हूँ।	I have not been singing songs since morning.			
Present Perfect continuous(question)				
क्या राम 2 घंटे से घूम रहा है?	has Ram been walking for 2 hours?			
मैं कब से गाने गा रहा हूँ?	Since when have I been singing songs?			
क्या वो सुबह से पढ़ रहा है?	Has he been studying since morning?

- 2. Might is right. जिसकी लाठी उसकी भैंस |
- 3. Tit for tat. जैसे तो तैसा।
- 4. Haste makes waste- आंगे दौड़ पीछे चौड |
- 5. Prevention is better than cure. इलाज से परहेज अच्छा |
