




उदाहरण : Question in (Future continuous tense)

Present perfect continuous tense (answer positive)	
मैं सुबह पाँच बजे से कपड़े धो रहा हूँ	I have been washing clothes since 5 am in the morning.
वह इस घर में जनवरी से रह रहा है	He has been living in this house since January.
लड़की सुबह से सो रही है	The girl has been sleeping since morning
हम इस विभाग में दो महीनो से काम कर रहे हैं।	We have been working in this department for two months.
Past perfect continuous tense(answer)	
वह दो घन्टे से स्टेज पर गाना गा रही थी	She had been singing song for two hours
शाहिद सोमवार से कठिन परिश्रम कर रहा	Shahid had been working hard since Monday.
था	
वे एक घन्टे से स्टेशन पर आपकी प्रतीक्षा कर रहे थे	They had been waiting for you on the station for one hour.



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तुम अपना पाठ सुबह से याद कर रहे थे	You had been learning your lesson since morning.
वे दोनों भाई दो घन्टे से अपने खेत में पानी	Those two brothers had been watering their field
दे रहे थे	for two hours.
future perfect continuous tense (Answer)	
वह स्बह से कार चला रही होगी	She will have been driving car since Morning.
वें (लौग) सुबह से फुटबॉल खेल रहे होगे	They will have been playing football since Morning.
हम दोपहर से एग्जाम दे रहे होंगे	We will have been facing exam since afternoon.
में दो घंटे से यात्रा कर रहा होगा	I will have been travelling for two hours.



उदाहरण: Question in (Future perfect continuous tense)

MAY- we use may to take or give permission for example:-

	क्या मैं अंदर आ सकता हूँ	
1	*	May I come in?
2	क्या मैं आज उसे पिट सकता हूँ।	May I beat him today?
		May I go to the market
3	क्या मैं आज बाजार जा सकता हूँ।	today?
4	क्या मैं बाहर जा सकता हूँ	May I go out?
	क्या में बाहर जा सकता हूं क्या मुझे आपकी कलम मिल सकती है	
5	*	May I have your pen?

May- We also use may to show possibility for example:-

1	आज वर्षा हो सकती हैं	It may rain today.
2	मेरी बहन आज आ सकती हैं	My sister may come today.
3	मैं आज बाहर जा सकता हूँ	I may go out today.

Might- we use might to show less possibility for example:-

	Person	Singular	Plural
1	First	I might come.	We might come.
2	Person	शायद मैं आ सकता हूँ .	शायद हमलोग आ सकते हैं.
3	Second	You might come.	You might come.
	Person	शायद आप आ सकते हैं.	शायद आपलोग आ सकते हैं.
4	Third Person	He / She / It / Ram might come.	They / The boys might come.

Some Common dialogues for daily use:

- Rest is rust ज्यादा आराम हानिकारक होता है
- It's slip of tongue मेरी ज्बान फिसल गई
- One fish spoils the whole pond एक मछली पूरे तालाब को खराब कर देती है
