

Definition of subjective case/ nominative case of nouns or pronoun-Nouns or Pronoun used as the subject of a verb in a sentence are called the subjective case or nominative case.

Examples

- a) Seema will sing a song.
- b) Jack will come here tomorrow.
- c) Manoj is very busy with the new work.
- d) Alex will assist you in this project.

Pronouns are also used to show the nominative case

They are-

- I
- you
- he
- she



- it
- they
- We

Examples

- They bought a villa.
- It was his mistake.
- She likes ice cream.
- He is a lawyer.
- I am designing the visiting card .

****these are the pronouns that are usually the subject of a sentence and perform the action in that sentence

****Pronoun that are not nominative(because they are being affected by the subject and a verb in a sentence)

Examples

- a) me
- b) them
- c) her
- d) him
- e) us

Examples-

- Nobody will listen to me.
- The students don't understand him.

In above sentences nouns are affected by verb and subject so it's not subjective pronouns .
