Case - The case of a noun tells us about the position of that noun in a sentence.

There are three types cases.

1) Nominative case -

Deepika hits Rita.

In the sentence what is the relation of Deepika to the verb hit, Deepika stands as the subject of the verb hit subject of a verb it is said to be in the nominative case. DEFINITION- any noun or pronoun that is the subject of a verb is said to be in the nominative case. Nominative case is also known as Subjective case.

examples

- 1) Madan went to Rishikesh (who went -Madan)
- 2) The market is full of people (what is full -market)
- The police arrested the robber (who arrested the robberpolice)
- 4) Sohan bought a cake (who bought a cake- Sohan)
- 5) The pot was broken by child (what was broken- the pot)



2) Objective Case :

Note the sentence below:

Deepika hits Rita .what is the relation of Rita with hit the noun ,Rita stands as an object of the verb hit when the noun Rita stands as in the object of verb hit is said to be in objective case .

DEFINITION- any noun or pronoun that is the object of a verb is said to be in the objective case.

- 1) Teacher teaches me. (Whom does teacher teaches-me)
- 2) Karan threw a stone. (What did karan throw-stone?)

3) My father bought a digital watch (what did your father brought-digital watch)

3) Possessive Case :

See the following sentences:

- 1) This is <u>Meena's</u> book.
- 2) Is that your <u>daughter's</u> bag.
- 3) My <u>uncle's</u> home is beautiful.
- In these sentences the underlined nouns are possessive.

Possesive means something which is of the noun Meena, uncle, daughter is in the possesive case.

****The possessive case is sometimes called genitive case. Some examples of possessive case

- 1) Madan attends a <u>boy's</u> school.
- 2) Meena's lehenga is beautiful.
- 3) Rohan found the sparrow's nest.
